Healthcare is a reflection of the communities we serve, and the past two years have been a roller-coaster for all of us. But the disruptions we faced highlight the importance, fortitude and



perseverance of our dental teams. During this time AGD continued to evolve and find ways to support its membership

and sustain value. The AGD has been at the forefront of developing ideas and creating policies keeping our staff and patients safe. No doubt, we've always known the value of working together, but the pandemic and lessons from the past two years have reinforced the importance of our strength in numbers. I'm confident with our collective focus we can prevail.

Since becoming a Trustee in November, there have been a lot of changes occurring within our organization. AGD has provided strong support for the Oral Health Literacy (OHL) and Awareness Act Bill, H.R.4555, that passed the House and now resides in the Senate (where it has referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pension). Our past president, Dr. Cassis, testified last year before the Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Health regarding this bill which will allocate \$75,000 per year to get the OHL program up and running. AGD President, Dr. Botko, established stronger relationships with the Public-Private partners' network, headed by RADM Tim Ricks, and strengthened our alliances with the American Dental Association, American College of Dentists, Dental Trade Alliance and many others.

The second Board of Trustee (BOT) meeting was held at the AGD's headquarters in March and some of the significant highlights included the hiring of a new Vice President of Finance, Cameron Hawkins, and Director of Meetings, Lauren Spencer. Mr. Cameron is the former director of finance of the American Medical Association and chief financial officer of the American Dental Hygienist Association with corporate experience with Duetshce, Direct Alliance Corp and Office Depot. The interim team of Julie Thompson and Kim McBride will ensure a smooth transition and finish work on critical projects. Ms. Spencer comes from the American College of Healthcare Executives. She has an extensive background and experience in the healthcare meetings industry, strategy, marketing and member services. Our interim Director of Meetings, Jennifer Hopkins, has already began a smooth transition since Lauren's arrival in March. The AGD enthusiastically welcomes Mr. Hawkins and Ms. Spencer knowing they will be great assets to the organization.

It's hard to believe the Scientific Session is right around the corner. This year's meeting is again a hybrid format, including a virtual package; course registration is now open. Royal Canadian Dental Corps Newsletter

Royal Canadian Dental Corps Message

A deployment to Erbil author: Master Corporal Carla Prowse

As a Dental Technician of the Royal Canadian Dental Corps (RCDC), I had the opportunity to deploy as one of a twomember Canadian Dental

Team on Operation Impact (Op IMPACT) in Erbil, Iraq. I had the pleasure of working alongside Captain Parent (Dental Officer). Our mission under Operation Inherent Resolve was to provide emergency and urgent dental care to the members of the Coalition Forces throughout the northern Joint Operations Area. We delivered care to patients serving in the local Kurdistan region and from as far away as Syria.

The RCDC's Mobile Dental Clinic (MDC) has been in Erbil since November 2016 and the RCDC's deployed dental teams continued to work alongside the American Navy Expeditionary Role 2 Medical Unit. The majority of procedures performed included: root canal therapy, incision and drainage, extractions, restorations and re-cementing crowns. Along with dental emergency coverage, Capt Parent and I had an additional role to provide triage and expectant care to casualties during mass casualty (MASCAL) incidents. Thankfully, our team only participated in MASCAL training exercises and were never required to utilize this critical training.

During our rotation, there were some challenging cases that presented and our dentistry skills were put to work on a daily basis. We encountered some anticipated challenges such as language barriers; however, the environment in which we had to practise added to the challenges of providing care. Some additional hurdles included: limitations in radiographic capabilities, the reduced selection of dental materials and there was no dental lab available. However, as a result of our enthusiastic teamwork and our preparedness for deployment, these difficulties did not negatively impact our ability to provide a high standard of dental care to our coalition members.

Among all the challenges we faced during the deployment, my biggest one was on the personal side. I felt I was not able to contribute during the ups and downs of everyday life back home. However, I received continual love and support via emails, letters and care packages from loved ones which bolstered my enthusiasm every day. I very much appreciated these connections to life back in Canada. The support of our family had a huge impact on our contribution to the mission.

Shortly after arriving in theatre, we learned that the RCDC would not be continuing its presence in Iraq and our tour would be cut short in order to share this amazing experience with the members of the incoming Roto. The impending absence of a Canadian deployed dental team in Erbil was understandably received by coalition colleagues with mixed feelings. The Canadian dental team continued to be held in high regard and the contribution from all of the RCDC dental teams over many years provided a substantial contribution appreciated by so many. Consequently, our next task was to aid the Role 2 to prepare a dental emergency contingency plan. At the time, no other nation was selected to replace the Canadian dental team. The Canadian Camp Érable officially closed in Jan 2022. The few remaining Canadian Armed Forces members, proudly wearing the Canadian flag, were warmly welcomed by our American neighbours on their camp.

It was a privilege to serve during this deployment. Working in the MDC should be experienced by as many dental personnel as possible as it is important professional development. Captain Parent and I shared so many memorable moments. We will cherish the bonds we have created with our coalition colleagues. The RCDC can be proud of its—contribution to Op IM-PACT. The contribution of a two-person dental team may seem small in the big picture but the positive impact on the wellbeing of our patients is immense. We are proud to have represented the RCDC, the CAF and Canada during our deployment.

This will help prevent AGD from transferring you from your Federal Service constituent to the constituent of the state to which you are moving. It is not necessary to send changes to Region 17.
