Friday Course Outline

This course is designed for the dental clinician who desires to stay at the forefront of the latest scientific advancements, endodontic techniques and schools of thought. Discussion will include diagnosis and treatment planning, NiTi metaallergy and irrigation technologies that are cutting edge and changing endodontic therapy. This course will cover:

- The Science & Physics of Instrumentation: Advances in metallurgy and file engineering that address cyclic fatigue and file separation.
- Efficiency with fewer files: Design enhancements that deliver consistent canal shapes in less time and with fewer instruments.
- Energized Irrigation Protocols: New technologies and techniques for removing bacteria and the smear layer.
- Obturation: State-of-the-art, centrally condensed gutta-percha technologies vs. single-cone techniques.

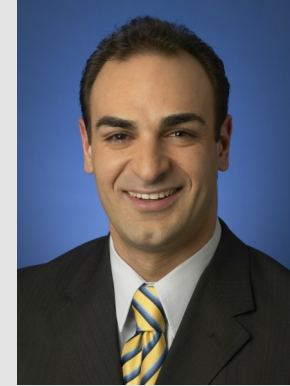
Hands-On Automated Endodontic Workshop

****NOTE: The hands-on portion is limited to 30 people.**

The use of hand files has virtually been eliminated except to pathfind and negotiate dilacerated curves. Participants in this course will do root canal preparations utilizing the latest technological advancements in nickel titanium instrumentation. Demonstration followed by hands-on participation will teach the attendee how to achieve preparation with greater ease and less iatrogenic problems. The newest developments in thermoplasticized carrier obliteration will be available for attendees to utilize.

Requirements for Participation Course

1. Participant must bring extracted teeth which have had endodontic access prepared. Several anterior, bicuspid and molar teeth are recommended. Teeth should be unmounted or if mounted, measure and record length of tooth and place a wax ball over the apex.
2. Gloves and face masks should be brought by each participant if so desired.
3. Course director (Dr. Camp) will provide electric handpieces, hand endodontic files, rotary nickel-titanium files and carrier devices for obturation.
