STATE OF THE ART ENDODONTICS: DIAGNOSIS TO OBTURATION AND THE CLEAN IN BETWEEN

Endodontic success is dependent on a variety of interrelated factors, but removal of bacteria is the ultimate goal. However, the pathway of endodontic diagnosis is filled with twists and turns that often prevent the clinician from making a definitive Endodontic diagnosis. In the worst-case scenario, diagnostic pitfalls will lead to inaccuracies, resulting in unnecessary or inappropriate treatment. This review, based on actual clinical cases, will highlight a variety of diagnostic roadblocks including the limitations of pulp testing and non-odontogenic sources of pain. After a definitive diagnosis has been established, it is imperative that all canals are located and cleaned to the root apex to achieve maximum disinfection. This session will place special emphasis on locating the hard to find canals prior to using a rotary instrument to establish a predictable and reproducible glide path to the root apex. A single file reciprocating system to create the final shape will be presented along with enhanced irrigation protocols for maximum disinfection of the root canal system. Finally, state of the art obturation options will be presented to complete this comprehensive review.
