DR. KARL KOERNER, DDS, MS

Dr. Koerner has presented hundreds of didactic and participation oral surgery courses to general dentists in the U.S. and abroad. He has been an Associate Professor in Oral Surgery and is now Adjunct Professor at Roseman College of Dental Medicine in Utah. Dr. Koerner is the author of 30 articles on various aspects of oral surgery for the general dentist and has authored or co-authored four books on oral surgery. In addition, he has made several surgery DVDs with Dr. Gordon Christensen.

He is past president of the Utah Dental Association and Utah Academy of General Dentistry. Though not an oral surgeon, Dr. Koerner received surgery training in the U.S. Army and in his Utah general practice performed only oral surgery for over 20 years. He was given the National AGD's Weclaw Award for contributions to general dentistry and dental education, the Utah Dental Association's Distinguished Service Award, and the University of Washington School of Dentistry's Distinguished Alumnus Award.

Dr. Koerner speaks Mandarin Chinese and has conducted many trips to different parts of China for exchanges with Chinese dentists and partners with Chinese colleagues to provide humanitarian treatment for children. Dr. Koerner is Director of The Koerner Center for Surgical Instruction, an international organization providing oral surgery training for general dentists (www.koernercenter.com).

Moderate Third Molar Impactions for the General Dentist

Dentists who already know how to do “surgical extraction” can become qualified to remove easier impacted 3rds. It involves a slightly different skill-set to include familiarity with local anatomy, more precise bone and soft tissue management, more sectioning protocols, working within limited time frames, airway protection, reliable local anesthesia, and anxiety management. Patient selection is key. Sedation (inhalation, oral, IV) is recommended, especially for multiple third molars. This course emphasizes mandibular third molars above the mandibular canal and maxillary third molars erupted to the CEJ level of the second molars. It can be a refresher for those who removed these teeth in AEGDs GPRS, oral surgery internships, and personal mentor ships. It covers removing maxillary erupted third molars without tuberosity fractures. An important aspect is preventing, or if necessary, managing complications. The standard of care is set at the same level as cases done by oral and maxillofacial surgeons. The course is especially relevant to community health practitioners removing individual third molars that are symptomatic, pathologic, and/or in communication with oral fluids. Patient age, depth, angulation, and proximity to the ascending ramus or sinus are factors discussed in assessing difficulty. Multiple life-like dentoform models provide seven different types of impactions for removal by participants.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- More easily remove moderate third molar impactions (single or multiple) predictably and according to accepted standards of care.
- Prevent and/or manage complications that can occur during or after oral surgery.
- Evaluate and select third molar impaction patients that are within the capability of the practitioner performing the case. Otherwise, refer to another clinician.
