Forensic Dentistry (Afternoon Course)

COURSE OUTLINE

Forensic dentistry is the application of dental knowledge to medico-legal situations. It could be identification of human remains, age assessment or potential malpractice situation. The course will discuss the history of forensic dentistry and its use in mass disasters and the integration of computer technology to aid in identification. It will also discuss bite mark analysis and the controversy associated with it.



Michael Kaner DMD JD, MAGD graduated from the University of Rochester and Tufts University School of Dentistry in 1985. After completing a General Practice Residency in Allentown, Pennsylvania, he assumed the practice of a retiring dentist in Feasterville, Pennsylvania, where he has practiced since 1986. In 2003 he earned a JD degree from Concord Law School and is a member of both the State Bar of California and the District of Columbia. A Master of the Academy of General Dentistry and past President of the Pennsylvania AGD, he was a national trustee for the AGD and President of the AGD Foundation, the charitable arm of the AGD. Dr. Kaner is a trained forensic dentist and is a member of DMORT, the US Federal disaster response team. He was part of the team that helped identify those killed on 9/11 in both Somerset County, Pennsylvania, where Flight 93 crashed and at the Medical Examiner's Office in New York City. In addition, he spent two weeks in Mississippi after Hurricane Katrina and two weeks in New York City at the onset of the Covid-19 crisis.
