Introduction to Surgical Principles in Dental Implantology:

COURSE OUTLINE

The utilization of dental implants as a viable tooth replacement option can provide predictable, aesthetic, fixed or removable and functional implant prosthesis to improve the quality of life for our patients.

Proper treatment planning followed by precision in execution of surgical placement of dental implants can yield high survival rates for the final implant prosthesis. Implant surgery has inherent risks and complications documented in the scientific literature and in clinical practice. This work shop will highlight the general principles for implant placements and to avoid surgical complications or misadventures.

The model based hands on course will serve as an introduction to principles in surgical placement of dental implants. A step by step protocol to achieve success in osseousintegration of dental implants will be covered with the following topics:

- Fundamentals in implant treatment planning and utilization of cone beam computer tomography (CBCT)
- Goals of implant surgery
- Decision making for various surgical guide options
- Drill protocols for optimal osteotomy preparation
- Osteotomy preparation for various bone densities



Dr. Mark H.E. Lin graduated from the University Of Toronto in the Biochemistry Specialists honours program. He received his dental degree from University of Detroit Mercy in which he was on the Dean's list for 4 consecutive years and finished within the top 5% of the class. He then completed a 1-year General Practice Residency program at the Miami Valley Hospital in Dayton Ohio, where he received his training in hospital dentistry, Intravenous sedation and advanced surgical training. He practiced general dentistry for 13 years then return to complete his postgraduate training in the specialty of Prosthodontics at the University Of Toronto.

He maintains a full time specialty practice as a Prosthodontist at Toronto Dental Specialist (TDS) centre with focus on full mouth reconstructions, dental implant surgery, various grafting procedures, implant prosthetics and management of implant complications.

He is a Fellow and Diplomate with the International Congress of Oral Implantologist (I.C.O.I.). He is an Associate fellow and Fellow with the American Academy of Implant Dentistry (A.A.I.D.) and faculty with the Asia Maxicourse Implant Residency program. He is also a graduate and Fellow with the Misch Implant Institute. Finally, he is a Diplomate with the American Board of Oral Implantology/Implant Dentistry (A.B.O.I.). He was a former co-director of the University of Toronto's Aesthetics residency program, former co-director of the Implant Prosthodontic Unit and post graduate Prosthodontic program at University of Toronto. He is currently an Associate in Dentistry at University of Toronto at the post graduate Prosthodontic department. He is a Fellow and serves as an Examiner with the Royal College of Dentists of Canada in the specialty of Prosthodontics.
