Dr. Goth Siu is a Board Certified Specialist in Prosthodontics in both Canada and in the US. He completed his specialty program at the University of Illinois in Chicago where he received extensive training in both the surgical and prosthetic aspects of implant treatment, computer-guided surgery, cosmetic and reconstructive dentistry. His area of research is in dental implants and restorations in the esthetic zone. His research is funded by grants from the American Academy of Esthetic Dentistry, American Academy of Implant Dentistry and the Northeastern Gnathological Society. Dr. Siu is a clinical instructor at the University of Toronto Faculty of Dentistry.

Dr. Siu received his Bachelor of Health Sciences degree from McMaster University. He then completed his Doctor of Dental Medicine degree at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia. During his time there, he received multiple awards including the Academy of Osseointegration Award for Outstanding Student in Implant Dentistry and the E.Howell Smith Award in Prosthetic Dentistry. He was also inducted into the Omicron Kappa Upsilon National Honor Society and the Matthew Cryer Honor Society, the highest academic honor awarded to the top ten students in each class.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The rationale, principles and management of the tooth replacement therapies and dental occlusion as it applies to our clinical dentistry is of vital importance for the long-term success of our dentistry. The use of fixed and removable prosthodontics with dental implants can provide viable treatment options for our patients. In addition, when the functional physiologic occlusion has been deteriorated to pathologic or non physiologic occlusion, the reconstruction of the occlusion and the masticatory complex can be complex.

This program will address the various topics that are essential to understand the biologic and biomechanical principles required to develop fixed and /or removable prosthetic options and functional occlusion for our patients for long term stability, comfort and physiologic function.
