

Royal Canadian Dental Corps Newsletter

Royal Canadian Dental Corps Message

25th Anniversary Swiss Air Flight 111

On September 2nd, 1998, a McDonnel Douglas MD-11 departed JFK International Airport, New York bound for Cointrin Airport, Geneva.

At 10:30 p.m., Swissair Flight 111 crashed off the coast of Nova Scotia near St. Margaret's Bay, not far from the iconic Peggy's Cove. 215 passengers and 14 crew members representing 20 nationalities died in an instant. This disaster would put in motion the formal steps to prepare and maintain a high-readiness Disaster Victim Identification (DVI) capability within the Royal Canadian Dental Corps (RCDC).

What ensued following the crash was an extraordinary collaborative effort, beginning as search and rescue, then quickly turning to search and recovery. Transport Safety Board Canada (TSB), Canadian Armed Forces (CAF), Canadian Coast Guard (CCG), Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), United States Navy (USN), Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and other agencies contributed to this massive effort. The Canadian Forces Dental Service (CFDS – RCDC so named at the time) contributed profoundly to the identification efforts under Op PERSISTENCE. Fifteen thousand pieces of fragmented remains were recovered, ultimately necessitating the unique skills of 22 CAF dentists and 26 dental technicians.

Dental teams were assigned to Antemortem (AM) Records, Postmortem (PM) Records and Comparison. Dental Trucks (Special Equipment Vehicles – SEVs) were used as dental radiography units. The dental teams worked in concert with the RCMP, who were responsible for overall processing and fingerprint analysis. Everyone was ultimately responsible to the Medical Examiner, Dr. John Butt. Dental teams, quick to leverage their specialist knowledge, created a

database categorizing unique dental characteristics found within the AM records. This database allowed the Comparison team to efficiently identify some remains. Other efficiencies were linked to other identifiers (tattoos, wallets) that suggested an AM dental record as a potential match. Challenges were encountered when there was a lack of AM evidence such as radiographs, or a lack of PM evidence such as small alveolar fragments with unrestored or avulsed teeth.

Identification efforts (other than DNA) concluded 29 Oct 1998. The dental teams processed 198 AM record files and conducted 313 PM examinations resulting in 102 identifications made by dental record comparison. There were also 46 identifications by fingerprint and medical radiographs and 1 by visual means. Approximately 100 identifications were made by DNA after 1370 DNA samples were processed – an extraordinary number for the time. The CFDS was very proud of their achievement and the resulting closure for the families and friends of the victims of Swissair Flight 111. Everyone involved was profoundly affected.

In the years that followed, forensics within the CFDS evolved. In 2001, there were 17 CAF dentists forensically trained across Canada. In 2012, the Canadian Forces Forensic Odontology Response Team (CF FORT) was officially formed as a high-readiness asset of the RCDC, CAF and Government of Canada. Comprised of a 12-member high-readiness team with 2 additional advisory positions, CF FORT stands ready to respond to DVI requirements identified by the Government of Canada, whether domestic or international. Each year, the team undergoes individual and collective training while maintaining plans and equipment to ensure the capability to deploy within 48hrs.

Preparedness is often born from tragedy. This September 2nd will be 25 years since Swissair Flight 111 crashed taking 229 lives. The subsequent aftermath resulted in much personal anguish for all - we have not forgotten, we stand proud, and we stand ready.
