



E-mail change? PCS or other move?

It is very important that you contact AGD when your E-mail address changes and/or you move. This will ensure that you receive your AGD publications and *The Federalist* newsletter in a timely fashion. Prompt notification also saves Region 17 and National AGD the cost of additional mailings.

You can make changes with AGD in one of several ways. You can call AGD's membership department at **1-888-AGD-DENT**, send an e-mail to <u>membership@agd.org</u>, update your profile on <u>www.agd.org</u>, or send your changes to AGD, 560 W. Lake St., 6th Floor, Chicago, IL 60661-6600. Be sure to include your member number and specify the Federal Service to which you belong. This will help prevent AGD from transferring you from your Federal Service constituent to the constituent of the state to which you are moving. It is **not** necessary to send changes to Region 17.
